Brief Statement of the Situation

Mrs Davis has come to discuss the safety of oral contraception for her daughter, Marilyn, 17 years, who lives at home and is a year 12 student.

Unbeknown to her parents, Marilyn attended your partner yesterday, received the "morning-after" pill and was commenced on oral contraception. He subsequently discussed the case with you.

1. Definition and assessment of the patient(s) problems in physical, psychological and social terms.
 - Parent requires full and accurate information regarding contraceptive options and safety for dependent daughter.
 - Preserve daughter's confidentiality
 - Parental consent to prescribe may be needed (check State Law)
2. Plan of Management

Further work-up

- Indicate need to see daughter
- Blood pressure and weight and urinalysis would be needed
- No gynaecological examination at first visit
- Review of BP at four months
