About the IMG Education Program

The IMG Education Program is offered free of charge by GPTT to assist International Medical Graduates (IMG)s obtain vocational registration.

Who can join the Program?

The program is available to non-vocationally registered IMGs currently working as general practitioners in rural and remote Tasmania.

What can the program offer you?

- Access to GPRime
- Practice visits by Medical Educators
- Tools for developing Learning Plans
- Videoconferences
- Doctors Interpersonal Skills Questionnaire (DISQ)

The above services are at **no cost** to the participant.

What is expected of you?

You will be asked to:

- Be willing to support other IMG Support Program participants in meeting their learning needs.

You will be visited by GPTT's IMG Support Officer and assisted to sign up for the program through GPRime. At this visit you will be given a GPRime user name and password.
